SUBJECT: Oil Field Cleanup Program Quarterly Status Report, Fiscal Year 2021, 1st Quarter

Well Plugging: The 1st quarter performance for State-Managed Plugging includes 273 wells plugged with a total expenditure of \$6,477,442 using Oil and Gas Regulation and Cleanup (OGRC) and General Revenue funds. This includes wells that have been physically plugged, invoiced by the plugging contractor, and approved for payment by Field Operations. Additionally, during the 1st quarter, 555 wells were approved for plugging with State funds. A total of 463 wells were physically plugged through the end of the 1st quarter, of which, 273 have been invoiced and paid. The actual wells plugged and expenditure by district for fiscal years 2019, 2020 and 2021 and the well plugging goals and budgets by district for fiscal year 2021 are shown on the attached graphs. The fiscal year 2021 budget is \$34,550,000.


Site Remediation: The 1st quarter performance for Site Remediation includes 38 cleanup activities completed with a total expenditure of \$284,959.34 using OGRC funds. Additionally, during the 1st quarter 54 cleanup activities were authorized for cleanup with State funds. The actual remediation activities and expenditure by district for fiscal years 2019, 2020, and 2021 and the goals for the Site Remediation activities by district for fiscal year 2021 are shown on the attached graphs. The fiscal year 2021 budget is \$13,807,580.30.






